Lawrence Technological University provides resources for students looking for on- and off-campus employment.

- Students may work part-time, up to 20 hours per week on campus
- Applications for most student positions are accepted through LTU's online job discovery platform, Handshake

On-Campus Employment Options

Work Study is a federal or state program that reimburses employers for a portion of the costs associated with compensating student employees. Students qualify for work study by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and demonstrating financial need.

Student Employment refers to student assistant and research positions available through a number of offices and departments across campus.

*Work study is not required to obtain an on-campus job, nor does it guarantee an oncampus job.

On-Campus Employment Requirements

Students must:

- Be registered LTU students
- Be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours in an undergraduate program or 4 semester hours in a graduate program
- Be pursuing an LTU degree or certificate
- Maintain good academic standing (minimum 2.0 GPA)
